Thank you for your interest in our Summer School program. Described on the following pages are the classes being offered to students this year. The first session will be 8:30-10:10 and the second session will be 10:20-12:00.

Enrichment registration will be completed using the registration form at the back of the catalog. When reading class descriptions, please keep in mind that the grade level references are for the grade your child will have **completed** at the end of this school year (e.g., a 1st grade student this year would enroll in 1st grade offerings this summer). The teacher, according to qualifications, will generate registration for Review & Reinforcement, Review & Renew and ELL classes.

When selecting classes, please know that if a teacher has suggested enrolling your child in a Review & Reinforcement class, that suggestion should take precedence over any enrichment summer school class. The classroom teacher issues registration and approval forms for Review & Reinforcement classes. Enrichment classes have a minimum enrollment and will be cancelled if this enrollment is not met.

Registration will be handled through the District 34 Administration Office. Please return all paperwork and tuition checks payable to 'Glenview School District 34' to the address below. Your registration will not be considered complete until the district office has received a tuition check. Transportation is available for **all** students at a cost of \$50 for the term. Students enrolling in Review & Reinforcement classes that qualified for free or reduced lunch status this school year will not be required to pay for transportation for summer school.

Absolutely NO transportation will be accepted after May 5! You will be notified by email when all aspects of your registration are complete. Specific information regarding transportation, times and classroom teachers will be sent home the week before summer school begins.

This summer we will offer breakfast for students. The full price of breakfast will be \$1.70 and reduced cost breakfast will be \$.30. Students will use their school ID to purchase breakfast. If you are interested in your child accessing the option to purchase breakfast, please be sure to complete the breakfast section of the registration form. **Only students with parental consent will be allowed to purchase breakfast.**

Registration forms are due at time of registration. Registration forms for Review & Reinforcement classes must contain the Review & Reinforcement approval form with the Principal's signature. If you register and withdraw from a class after May 5, tuition minus a \$50 processing fee will be refunded. Registration is not considered complete until the district office receives tuition. Classes may be canceled due to low enrollment. You will be notified if this occurs, and tuition will be refunded if an alternate class is not selected.

Tuition

Summer School tuition is as follows:
